EMERGENCY RESILIENCE

The Parish Council has been contacted by the Westcountry Rivers Trusts' Rapid Response Catchments Project Officer for East Devon. They are working alongside Devon County Council on the Devon Resilience Innovation Project (DRIP) delivering our Upstream Thinking: Rapid Response Catchments project.

DRIP is funded by Defra as part of the £150 million Flood and Coastal Resilience Innovation Programme, which is managed by the Environment Agency to develop and test new approaches to help communities become more resilient to the effects of flooding and climate change. Under DRIP, Westcountry Rivers Trust have identified 10 rapid response catchments across Devon to work with. These are quickly draining catchments under 10km² where surface flows and overland runoff during high rainfall events can overwhelm small communities. East Budleigh has been identified as one of these 10 RRCs.

They will be working within the community to co-create and provide local solutions to the impacts of climate change, and testing community-maintained Nature Based Solutions (NBS) to reduce the effects of flooding and deliver multiple environmental benefits. They have a budget for the delivery and monitoring of innovative flood resilience measures and have already installed monitoring equipment along the Budleigh Brook.
