Emergency Plan

The Parish Emergency Plan is beginning to take shape.

In the coming weeks I will enlist the Community Response Team (CRT) to assist with amendments that will complete the task of converting the current draft Flood Plan into it's broader brief replacement.

At each stage our clerk will post the latest up to date version on the Council website where the draft Flood Plan currently resides.

In the meantime I have been working to produce a short summary Emergency Plan booklet that, I hope, will be more meaningful to most Parish residents.

I have posted hard copies of the summary to each Parish Councillor in the past few days.

The full Emergency Plan is at least 22 pages long and, by necessity, very detailed.

Whilst I expect it to be a decent reference document I hope the summary booklet will be of greater general interest.

I would like to circulate the final version booklet with the September edition of the Parish Magazine.
